
Welcome

GP SURGERY SECTOR-BASED
WORK ACADEMY PROGRAMME

Fatima Hamoudi's remarkable journey through the GP Surgery Sector-Based Work Academy Programme at Southwark College serves as a powerful testament to the transformative impact of dedicated education and training initiatives. Overcoming challenges such as a loss of confidence and health issues, Fatima found herself equipped with essential skills and knowledge through the course, ultimately leading to her successful employment.

"During the SWAP programme at Southwark College, I gained confidence in interview techniques and cover letter writing. I improved my skill set by learning the importance of tailoring my CV and exploring new avenues for job search. The program also provided valuable insights on software, legal rights of employees, and knowledge from guest speakers, which prepared me for future success in my career.

"After the course, I had the opportunity to shadow experienced professionals and made a strong impression, leading to a paid trial period offer. The program's teachings and the skills I acquired helped me secure the job I had been working towards, marking a significant turning point in my career. I highly recommend the GP Surgery SWAP course due to its high success rate and the significant impact it can have on employment opportunities. I encourage others to consider the course as a transformative step towards a successful career."

Fatima's story highlights the potential of the programme to not only provide employment but also valuable experience for future career endeavours. Fatima's gratitude towards those involved in organising the course echoes the life-changing influence of such educational opportunities.

4a. Supported internships

We are especially proud to provide Supported Internship programmes of which is designed to support neurodivergent young people develop employability skills in a work setting and progress onto employment.

Southwark College has been delivering Supported Internships for the last 4 years through specialised and bespoke internship placements in partnership with local employers, including The Young Vic, Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust, and Hilton London Bankside.

We are delighted 2023-24 has seen all six of our Supported Internship students who have completed their programme gain permanent work through one of their "on programme" work placements while studying at Southwark College.

We have watched our Supported Internship learners blossom from introverted people to gaining confidence and work experience to secure permanent work. Our Supported Internship delivery team work tirelessly in collaboration with local stakeholders to raise the awareness of employing neurodivergent young people.

4b. Sector Work based Academy Programmes (SWAPs)

SWAPs are a six-week programme connected to an employer with guaranteed interviews for genuine vacancies. We are proud to have a long-standing relationship with Guys and ST Thomas Trust for the NHS, Health and care Job Hub for South London NHS and a long standing Security guard course.

303 local unemployed citizens have enrolled on our SWAP programmes we have delivered this year with 80 gaining sustainable work. This has shown one in four students gain sustainable

work on our SWAP courses and expecting this to rise as the outcomes are recorded up to four weeks after completing the course. We have worked in collaboration with the DWP and connected to all of our local Job Centre Plus to provide opportunities job seekers may not have necessarily had.

4c. T-Levels

We saw the launch of our first T-level programme in Digital Product development and Design. T -levels are the equivalent of A Levels aimed at providing technical learning in the form of a 315 or 45 day industry placement.

Connection to employers who can provide quality industry placements with genuine projects for students to complete in real working conditions has been key. Our strong connections to local employers have allowed students to flourish in gaining essential work experience in the field. Industry placements have included Coders and Founders, Associate of Colleges (AoC) and Guys and St Thomas.

" We were thrilled to have identified two T Level students from Southwark College for their industry placements. These students are now enhancing their skills, knowledge, and experience by contributing to various departments across the AoC. We look forward to continue working with the students over the next year to further develop their professional and employability skills."

5. Industry expertise and work experiences

As part of our Study programme for 16-18-year-old students we work with many stakeholders who are industry experts providing that all essential knowledge and work experience placements.

Many of our stakeholders are guest speakers at the college and provide essential work experience placements. We are very proud of our local connections and making sure students get industry related work experience to help them make informed decisions about their future goals.

In 2022/23 we placed 40 students in work experience to support their learning experience in the real world of industry. With the commitments and collaborations brought in by you as our stakeholders we increased this to over 450 students this year. We couldn't have done this without your support and on behalf of Southwark college thank all those who have supported our students.

Supported by the Mayor's Skills Academies Programme, the Health & Care Jobs Hub is a partnership of local colleges and health and social care employers across southeast London. The Jobs Hub have worked in collaboration with Southwark College in connecting local job seekers to local jobs in the Health and Care industry.

This has resulted in 170 local job seekers enrolling onto our SWAP programmes within the Health and Care industry, guaranteeing job interviews for real opportunities to step into work. 33 students from our health and care related SWAPs have already been offered permanent positions or agency work as a result of our programmes and expecting this to rise as people progress through the application process.

"We have built a really strong and successful partnership with the trainers and tutors, Claire Reed and the team at Southwark College in delivering and developing the Sector-Based Work Academy Programme (SWAP) scheme. 6. Southwark College Stakeholder Events

Southwark College has provided events throughout the year connecting to the local community and promoting career opportunities. These have been in the form of celebrations, networking events, workshops and Job Fairs, all providing the essential links to job opportunities, wider support services and industry knowledge and advice.

Some highlights of 2023-2024:



Southwark Business Awards 2024 (SBA)

Southwark College hosted The Southwark Business Awards 2024 on 15 February 2024. The event organised by White Label on behalf of Southwark Council and The Southwark Chamber of Commerce welcomed local employers for an evening of celebration of entrepreneurship, business excellence, growth and community spirit within the borough.



College careers fair and visit from the Permanent Secretary of the Department for Work and Pensions.

We were very pleased to host a careers and Job Seekers fair in collaboration with the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP). With over 250 16-18 students and 300 adult job seekers, the event saw local employers, including the London Ambulance, Transport for London (TfL), the Old Vic and Barclays connecting with our community bringing careers advice and job opportunities to one place.

The DWP took the opportunity to invite the Permanent Secretary, Peter Schofield, to the fair to visit our students and have an employer round table. This was a high-profile visit and was very successful giving us public endorsement on the work we have developed with the DWP and establishing us as a key stakeholder of the borough supporting local citizens into sustainable work.



The Elephant and Castle Town Centre Careers fair

The Elephant and Castle Town Centre regeneration project hosted a careers fair at Southwark College with 500 students and local job seekers attending the fair. More than 35 employers exhibited offering careers advice, work experience and apprenticeships in a wide range of industries including science, architecture and engineering.



Southwark Works 20th Anniversary.

We were very proud to host the 20th anniversary of Southwark Works, a free employment service working with local job seekers and employers funded by Southwark Council. DWP, CLF, council officers and community providers were present to support the celebrations. Successful job seekers told their stories of success, and the impact of Southwark works for the community was great to see.



Health & Care Jobs Hub SE London Integrated Care System

The Health & Care Jobs Hub has been instrumental in supporting our Health & Care SWAPs connecting to local employers and raising the awareness of opportunities to local job seekers. In July, we hosted a student reunion of all students who completed a SWAP programme with Southwark College and Lambeth College. Students who have been successful in gaining sustainable work gave speeches on their experience and employers supported with instant job interviews for students still looking for work. This resulted in three students being offered positions from the interviews on the day.
